Program Background

- Founded in 1986 by the Department of Insurance to provide people who are eligible for Medicare with an objective information service.
 - Direct response to growing concerns and questions about Medicare and related health insurance products.
- Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1990 created SHIPs nationally and made federal grants available to states for health advisory services for people with Medicare.
 - \$54 million is apportioned to 54 programs via a population-based formula.
 - NC receives some State Appropriations most SHIPs do not.

SHIIP

- To empower, educate and assist Medicare-eligible individuals, their families and caregivers, in making informed health insurance decisions that optimize access to care and benefits.
 - Free, unbiased, comprehensive health insurance counseling including long-term care insurance;
 - Outreach presentations, distributing information, participating in health fairs, community events, etc.;
 - Recruiting and training Volunteer and In-kind counselors to provide program services statewide.
 - Screen beneficiaries for Extra Help and Medicare Savings Programs. (Medicare Improvements for Patients and Providers/MIPPA)

Senior Medicare Patrol (NCSMP)

- Housed within the SHIIP Division at the NC Department of Insurance.
- Mission is to empower and assist Medicare beneficiaries, their families, and caregivers to prevent, detect and report suspected Medicare fraud and abuse through outreach, counseling, and education.
- Authorized in 1997 under Titles II and IV of the Older Americans Act, the Omnibus Consolidated Appropriations Act of 1997, and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.
 - \$32.2 million is apportioned to 54 programs via a population-based formula

NC SHIIP Organizational Chart

- Housed within human service agencies
- At least one site in each of NC's 100 counties
- Receive SHIP Base grant dollars to support SHIIP locally – formula based
- Most sites accept MIPPA Priority 1 – formula based

Local SHIIP Coordinating Sites

- Appointed by the local agency
- SHIIP/SMP certified
- Manage volunteer network within the county
- Manage SHIIP at local level

Certified SHIIP Coordinator



- Complete SHIP TA online training
- Additional state-specific trainings SMP, LTC, STARS, shadowing
- Volunteers are certified for SHIIP and SMP
- Nearly 700
- Direct-entry in STARS

Certified SHIIP Volunteer



- 1.5 Program Specialists support 50% of the state
- 2 Communication Specialists handle complex cases
- STARS crossover to SIRS

NCSMP



- 9 of 16 Area Agencies on Aging – fraud outreach
- Identity Theft/Shed-a-Thon Events – local coordinating sites

Sub-grantee



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Medicare

- Federally-funded individual health insurance program that provides coverage for medically-necessary procedures, services, medical supplies and equipment
 - For people age 65+, under 65 and receiving Social Security Disability Insurance for 24 months, or under 65 and with ESRD
 - Administered by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).
 - The Social Security Administration (SSA) is responsible for eligibility, enrollment, and entitlement.
 - Program is funded in part by Social Security and Medicare taxes you pay on your income, through premiums that people with Medicare pay, and by the federal budget.

Medicare in North Carolina

- 2,246,794 individuals are enrolled in Medicare.
 - Growing by leaps and bounds!
 - Approximately 17% due to disability.
- 16 Stand-Alone Medicare Part D Plans available in 2025.
- 163 Medicare Advantage Plans are available in 2025.

Beneficiary Assistance

- Provide comprehensive, personalized counseling on available options
 - New to Medicare (turning 65, or due to disability under age 65)
 - Working past age 65
 - Retiree coverage
- Review all options available including Original Medicare, Medicare supplement plans, Medicare Advantage Plans, and Medicare Part D;
 - Premiums, formularies, tiers, copayments, and contracted providers can, and do change annually
- Utilize the Medicare.gov Plan Finder to conduct Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage Plan comparisons

Beneficiary Assistance cont.

- Screening and submitting Extra Help applications; and
 - If eligible, a person can save money on their Medicare prescription drug costs;
 - Reduced monthly premium, deductible, and copayments, and Special Enrollment Period opportunities.
- Forwarding Extra Help applications to the State for further screening of Medicare Savings Programs (MSP).
 - If eligible, pays for Medicare Part B premium (\$185.00/month in 2025) and Medicare prescription drug costs.
 - Depending on eligibility level, may also pay the Part A/B deductibles and coinsurance amounts.
- Assist Medicare beneficiaries with billing disputes/issues and make referrals to state and federal partners for suspected cases of Medicare fraud.

Complaint Assistance

- Assist with processing beneficiary, legislative, and provider (Medicare Supplement and LTC-only) complaints;
- Medicare Parts A, B, C, and D are federally regulated by the Centers for Medicare
 Medicaid Services (CMS); and
 - Authority and resolution falls under CMS
 - NCDOI regulates insurance agents licensed to sell Medicare products.
- Utilize the CMS Complaint Tracking Module (CTM).
- Medicare Supplement and Long-Term Care Insurance is regulated at the state level.
 - Authority and resolution falls under NCDOI/SHIIP

2024 Outcomes

- Assisted 70,248 consumers across the state.
 - Including 23,688 calls answered by SHIIP staff.
 - Approximately 3% of the NC Medicare population.
- Completed 11,259 enrollments.
 - Medicare Part D: 8,569
 - Medicare Advantage Plan: 2,690
- Saved consumers more than \$35 million*.
- Processed 1,063 complaints.

Federal Funding Status

- Federal health agencies were directed to pause all external communications effective 01.22.25.
 - Includes communications from ACL and CMS to the SHIP, SMP, and MIPPA networks.
- The SHIP Base, MIPPA, and SMP programs were implicated by the President's recent Executive Orders.
 - Fortunately, we can access the funds.
- Current federal grant awards:
 - SHIP Base Grant: \$1,626,508.00
 - SMP: \$903,505.00
 - MIPPA Priority Area 1 (SHIP): \$595,340.00; Priority Area 2 (AAA): \$620,165.00; Priority Area 3 (ADRC): \$333,680.00

SHIP Base Grant

- Current SHIP Base grant award expires on 03.31.25.
 - New application was submitted in December. Expected award date of 04.01.25
 - Partial awards are forthcoming based on currently approved budget amounts/authorization by Congress through mid-March. However, all awards are subject to the availability of federal funds.
 - Majority of SHIP funding is provided through discretionary funding from the Labor, Health and Human Services, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act through the annual appropriations process.

SMP Grant

- In year two of a five-year project period.
 - Current award is \$903,505.00 with an annual budget period of 06.01 through 05.31.
 - All awards are subject to the availability of federal funds.
 - SMP funding is provided through mandatory and discretionary funding from CMS's Health Care Fraud and Abuse Control (HCFAC) Program account through the annual appropriations process.

MIPPA Grant

- MIPPA is a one-year grant that expires on 08.31.25
 - Outreach and assistance to low-income beneficiaries (Extra Help, MSP, preventative benefits).
 - At the request of NCDHHS, SHIIP submits a statewide plan for the three funding areas.
 - SHIIP serves as the fiscal pass through for Priority Areas 2 and 3.
 - Funding has been extended 12 times with bipartisan support. Without congressional action, it will expire on 03.14.25.

Federal Funding Impacts

- Staffing
 - 26 FTE's and one part-time
 - 11 funded through state appropriations
 - 15.5 100% supported through federal grants
- Loss of funds to local SHIIP sites/AAAs \$2,733,751.00
 - SHIP Base \$804,387.00
 - SMP \$692,400.00
 - MIPPA/Priority Areas 1-3: \$1,236,964.00
- Assisting fewer people
