




NC is Aging


Multisector Plan for Aging

Process of Developing NC's MPA






Plan: NC's Multisector Plan for Aging Journey

- In 2022, NC joined a learning collaborative with 10 other states on multisector plans for aging.
- Age My Way initiative conducted 3000+ surveys of older North Carolinians to understand their needs and what would be needed for North Carolina to become age-friendly for our community and hosted a summit to discuss the results.










On May 3, 2023, Governor Cooper directed NC to build an age-friendly state through the following initiatives:

- Multisector Plan for Aging
- Protection of Vulnerable Adults
- Summit on Nutrition Services for Older Adults
- Broadband Access and Digital Literacy Services
- Caregiving Workforce Strategic Leadership Group



Development

- June 2023 Launched the All Ages, All Stages NC planning process at a large kick off event. Established a steering committee, workgroups, and stakeholder members.
- Fall 2023 Conducted targeted focus groups to include the voice of underrepresented groups.
- Fall and Winter 2023 Convened workgroups. 200+ stakeholders developed objectives and recommendations.





Development

- Spring 2024 Reconvened the entire stakeholder community and sought public input to refine objectives and recommendations.
- Spring 2024 Launched paid media campaign: *I'm Still Here*
- May 2024 Produced Governor's Progress Report.
- Summer 2024 Prioritized recommendations to focus on the first two-years of implementation and worked across the Cabinet Agencies to increase buy in.



Supporting Older Adults and Their Families

Supporting Older Adults and Their Families

North Carolinians will have access to services and resources that will enable them to stay in their homes and communities as they age and will support their families in their efforts to provide care when needed.





Home and Community-Based Services

- Increase funding for home- and community-based services.
- Align NC policies with the Older Americans Act rules.
- Pursue data modernization.

Why this matters: There are 1,280,000 family caregivers in NC who provide 1.2 billion hours of unpaid care annually. This equates to \$16.5 billion of unpaid care.

Family Caregiver Support

- Provide caregivers with more support
- Sustain funding for NC Caregiver Portal
- Strengthen family leave policies
- Support developing a state tax credit for caregivers
- Create a unified referral system with a "no wrong door" approach to provide tailored support to caregivers



TOPIC AREA 2: Strengthening Communities for a Lifetime Strengthening Communities for a Lifetime

North Carolinians will live in communities, neighborhoods, and homes that support thriving at all stages and ages.







Why this matters:

Over half of renters aged 50+ spend over 30% of their income on rent. 1 in 5 individuals experiencing homelessness is 55 or older; 46% are unsheltered

Housing

- Increase funding for housing repairs and modifications
- Increase access to and sustainability of affordable housing
- Raise income eligibility for property tax relief programs
- Boost affordable housing development
- Encourage adoption of universal design principles
- Ensure evolving housing needs of aging individuals with disabilities
- Advocate for a more coordinated approach to addressing housing challenges



Adult Protective Services

- Pass statutory changes to address gaps in service delivery and update legal frameworks to improve the protection of vulnerable adults
- Advocate for state funding to ensure county departments of social services have the necessary resources to deliver effective APS, including emergency services.





Optimizing Health and Wellbeing

North Carolinians will have access to personcentered services and supports that will optimize their life-expectancy and health quality.





Why this matters: 7 in 10 adults (65+) will need some form of long-term care in their lifetime.

Annual cost of

- Home Health Aid: \$64,064
- Assisted Living Facility: \$69,225
- Private Room in a Nursing Home:

Long-Term Services and Supports

- Increase awareness of long-term care costs and Medicare limitations
- Address challenges including the delivery and long-term financing to help achieve a continuum of community services and supports



Workforce

- Ensure a skilled workforce for diverse aging field jobs
- Address recommendations from the Investing in North Carolina's Caregiving Workforce report
- Expand financial incentives for health care careers
- Expand consumer-directed options for caregiving to provide greater flexibility and personalization

North Carolinians will have the means to effectively plan for their later stages of life, including ensuring sufficient and sustainable financial provisions, fostering avenues for personal growth and for the betterment of their communities.

- Strengthen and expand volunteer engagement opportunities
- Expand appropriate employment opportunities
- Launch ageism education and advocacy campaigns
- Reduce out-of-pocket Medicare costs for lower-income adults
- Explore free tuition benefits
- Establish state-facilitated retirement savings programs
- Promote financial literacy and awareness of benefits/services
- Implement pre-retirement planning programs in the public and private sectors



Legislative Action Workgroup Focus Areas



- 1.Pass **NC Work and Save** legislation to increase financial security for older North Carolinians.
- 2.Establish a **Study Commission on Aging** to study and recommend legislation addressing issues impacting older adults.
- 3.Pass legislation to increase eligibility for the **Homestead Property Tax Exemption** for older adults and persons with disabilities, and potentially raise the level of property exempted from taxes.
- **4.Advocate for Medicaid funding** to maintain current eligibility and service levels for older adults and persons with disabilities.





NC's Data Dashboard Phase 1 – State, Regional & County Aging Profiles


